# From Our Executive Director/Director of Choirs and Board President

**Celebrating a Season of Song and Community at Sing St. John**  
At Sing St. John, we envision a world where every voice counts, where every person is welcomed without exception, and where our shared songs honor our traditions and uplift us all. Thanks to the generosity of our supporters, we are able to provide these experiences at no cost, ensuring everyone has the opportunity to sing or to listen, with open arms and open hearts.

Our 2023-2024 season was filled with growth, music, and joy across all of Sing St. John's programs, and we are delighted to share a few highlights:

## Community and Collaboration

We reached over 1,000 singers and audience members this year. Every kindergarten to grade five student on St. John — more than 250 children — participated in the All-Island Children's Choir, ensuring music is a part of every young student's life. Additionally, forty of our senior community members gathered each week to sing together, making their debut at our spring intergenerational event.

The St. John Recovery Choir and Ocama Youth Choir brought the spirit of the season to life with performances at the Bizarre Bazaar, Open Mic at Miss Lucy's, caroling around Cruz Bay, and a festive new Christmas Eve singalong at "A Very Salty Christmas" in Coral Bay. Our annual Holiday Celebration in Franklin Powell Park, in collaboration with St. John Methodist Church's Gospel Tones and Nazareth Evangelical Lutheran Church Choirs, was another highlight that brought our community together in song. During the winter-spring session, we sang to support community events for Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Light Up the Night, and Hurricane Supplication Day.



## Celebrating Legacy and Looking Ahead

In April, we honored the memory of Harry Belafonte with the “Jump in de Line!” intergenerational event in Franklin Powell Park. The event featured Sing St. John Recovery Choir, Ocama Youth Choir, Addis of the Addis Revolution, The Echo People, SJSA Bamboula Dancers led by Raven Phillips, and our Senior Singalong singers. Building on this spirit, we are excited to plan a “One Love” unity concert next season, featuring The Quelbé Resurrection Band as one of our new collaborators.

The Ocama Youth Choir also released a heartwarming music video, “Valentine,” an original song written by choir member Elena Magnie. You can view it on the Sing St. John YouTube channel — we’d love for you to subscribe and support our youth.

Our Senior Singalong program, led by Lucia Francis with Assistants Gwenavire Hyndman and Bodicea Gordon, was met with great enthusiasm as 40 seniors gathered at Adrian and St. Ursula’s senior centers to sing on alternating weeks. The live, televised rehearsals not only engaged seniors across the Virgin Islands but also gave in-person participants a chance to practice and enjoy music from the comfort of home.

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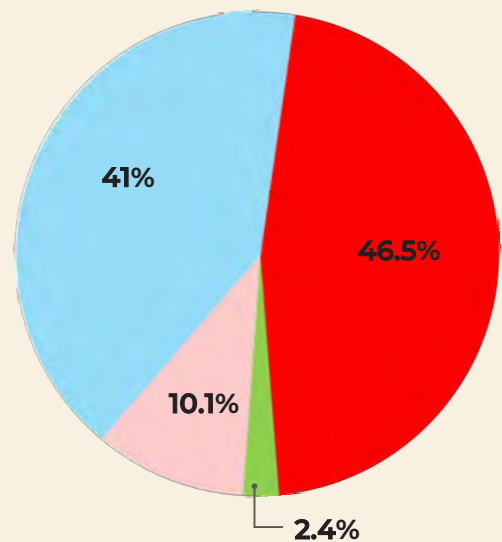
## Financials

- Other expenses: **\$3,691**

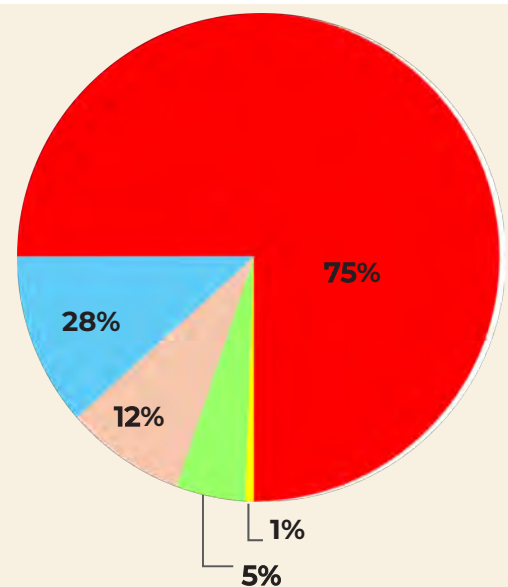

# Our 2023-2024 Programming

As the only community singing organization on St. John, we're committed to uniting islanders regardless of age, ability, and income level to connect through community singing. In difficult times and times of celebration, we continue to inspire hope and joy!



## St. John All-Island Children's Choir

In a community of 4000 year-round residents, resources are fewer than in larger communities, and we need to be a little creative, with a sharing attitude. St. John All-Island Children's Choir helps by providing free children's choir programming for the elementary school and homeschooled children on St. John. This program serves to connect the children through singing the same songs and playing the same games together. They present two moving concerts each year for our community. These concerts are livestreamed by AllAhWeTV and permanently on Sing St. John's YouTube channel, so that family and friends near and far are included.

## Partnering with St. John's Elementary Schools

In the spring, the Senior Singalong Choir performed for the first time in the park, and they are now excited to do more!

## In Memoriam....

### **Margie Labrenz & Beverly Biziewski**

Last season, St. John Singers said goodbye to two of our long-time members and past presidents: Margie Labrenz on September 5, 2023, and Beverly Biziewski on November 22, 2023.

For decades, these two wonder women kept St. John's singing community growing and embracing new projects. Under their leadership, St. John Singers collaborated with local musicians and choirs to perform in St. Thomas, Tortola, Virgin Gorda, and St. Croix.

In the early 1980's, Margie and a small but mighty group of singers from St. John would take the 5 pm boat and then a taxi to Charlotte Amalie High School to sing with the Caribbean Chorale. Traveling became expensive as well as inconvenient, so in 1982, they decided to form the St. John Singers – with John Cahill as their director. Soprano Beverly joined the choir and became an alto in order to sit by Margie and gossip throughout the rehearsals, much to Cahill's chagrin.

Over the next 35 years, Margie and Bev loved to organize musical celebrations at Hawksnest, especially during the holidays, with plenty of good food, cheerful whimsy and hours of singing.

In addition to singing with St. John Singers, both Margie and Beverly kept St. John's community organizations hopping, serving on boards for the Historical and Audubon societies as well as for AARP. If something needed to be done, they could always be depended upon to do it.

Margie and Beverly continued to sing until the end of their lifetimes. Even after enduring strokes, they still enjoyed getting gussied up to croon their favorite tunes for loved ones and caregivers.

We are ever grateful for Margie's and Beverly's creativity, fortitude and feistiness – we owe St. John Singers' longevity in large part to their passion and excellent leadership.
